Doug announced the passing of Chris Lawrence and Bill Boddy. Chris Lawrence, died of cancer aged 78, was a development engineer and racing driver who won more

than 100 races. His prowess as a tuner of engines helped revive the fortunes of the Morgan sports car in 1962, when his famous Plus 4 racer won its class in the Le Mans 24-hour race at an average speed of 94mph. He masterminded Morgan's return to Le Mans in 2002 and 2004 with the Aero 8 sports car, his last major project. William Boddy, who has died aged 98, was the editor of Motor Sport magazine from 1936 to 1991. His career spanned 81 years in total; he wrote his first piece for Motor Sport in 1930 and filed his final column for the magazine a week before he died, still working on a typewriter and making copious handwritten corrections to his copy.

New Business

We have been given the option of holding meetings either upstairs in the banquet room or downstairs in the Lounge. By a large majority of a show of hands at the meeting, it was decided that we would hold all future meetings in the **downstairs** lounge at the Legion. 
Doug Unia identified Merv Steg's Car of the Month - the Jensen Healy.
